METHODOLOGY

1. Clue 10 tells us that **David** works in office number 1.
2. Clue 15 tells us that office number 2 must be **blue**.
3. Clues 6 and 2, combined, tell us that **David's** office must be **yellow** – it cannot be **red** (clue 2) nor **green** or **orange** (clue 6).
4. Clue 8 tells us that **David** must drink **water**.
5. Clue 12 tells us that the **labrador** must be in office number 2.
6. **David** must read the **Telegraph** – he cannot read the **Sun** (clue 4), the **Guardian** (clue 5) the **Daily Mail** (clue 9) or the **FT** (clue 13).
7. The **Daily Mail** is read in office number 3 (clue 9).

8. The **green** office must be office number 4 – it cannot be office number 5 (clue 6) and cannot be office number 3 (clue 9).
9. The **orange** office must be office number 5 (clue 6) leaving the **red** office to be office number 3.
10. **Giles** must work in office number 3 (clue 2).
11. The **Sun** must be delivered to office number 4.
12. If the **orange juice** drinker reads the **FT** (clue 13), and **Rachel** reads the **Guardian** (clue 5), then between them they must account for office numbers 2 and 5 (but we do not yet know which) because they are the only two offices for which we do not yet know the newspapers. That means that by a process of elimination, **Mark** must be in office number 4.
13. If **Ron** owns a **golden retriever**, then he can only work in office number 5. **Rachel** must, therefore, work in office number 2 and read the **Guardian**.
14. By elimination, the only person now who can be the **orange juice**-drinking **FT** reader is **Ron** in office number 5.
15. By elimination, the only person now who can be a **tonic water**-drinking **greyhound** owner is **Giles** in office number 3.
16. If the **Great Dane** owner is next to the office of the **tea** drinker (clue 11) then **Rachel** must drink tea and **David** must be the **Great Dane** owner.
17. **Mark**, therefore, must be the owner of the **Chihuahua**.
