# MR. JONES' LAST PUZZLES

## BACKGROUND

Before his untimely death, Mr. Jones had identified a Russian mole operating amongst the five workers in Hut 17 at Bletchley Park.

Out of an abundance of caution, he concealed the identity of the mole in a set of 15 clues, which could only be obtained from one person, the Spymaster, on production of the password found at the end of a series of four puzzles.

Solve the first puzzle to find the location of the second puzzle, and so on.

After locating, and solving, the first four puzzles, return to the Spymaster, give him the password and your solutions and you will receive the clues for the final puzzle.

The solution to the final puzzle will identify the mole.

Your mission, should you choose to accept it, is to identify the mole.

## THE FASTEST TEAM (AFTER PENALTIES) WINS

Overleaf there are a few rules, and some generic notes and hints. Each puzzle may also have a section outlining specific notes and hints for that puzzle.

IF IN DOUBT, ASK THE SPYMASTER FOR GUIDANCE!

#### RULES

#### TEAMS MUST STAY TOGETHER DURING THE HUNT

There is **NO** prohibition on using the internet

Teams will be handicapped by the addition of a time penalty to their end result, calculated based on the size of the team.

1 person: No handicap

2 people: 10 minute handicap

3 people: 20 minute handicap

4 people: 30 minute handicap

#### ANSWER SHEETS

You should keep your answer sheets as you progress through the puzzles, and hand them into the Spymaster when you give him the password to collect the final puzzle.

#### **ABOUT NOTES AND HINTS**

If you stuck on a puzzle, the Spymaster may be able to give you a hint, or one or more clues.

Certain puzzles allow you to submit an incomplete answer sheet, taking a corresponding penalty for doing so.

Each puzzle has an introduction section which sets out what clues may be available, and any time penalties for incomplete answers.

Any time penalties incurred during Puzzles 1 to 4 will be added to your final time. Some time penalties are fixed, some are variable to balance out team sizes.

#### PUZZLE 1 - BEN HUH?

#### INTRODUCTION

Being a renowned movie buff, Mr. Jones has hidden the location of Puzzle 2 amongst a series of film titles from which he has either **added**, **removed**, or **changed one letter**, in each case helpfully also giving a clue to the new film's plot.

Work out the **new** film title. If a letter is **added** or **removed**, then insert that letter into the answer (the answers are in the correct order). If a letter is **changed** then insert either the original, or the replacement letter into the answer (you will have to work out which).

#### **EXAMPLE**

If the clue is "Tom Hanks leads a band of soldiers across Normandy to de-stubble Matt Damon" the answer would be "Shaving Private Ryan" and the letter to go into the answer would be 'H' as that is the letter which has been added.

#### NOTES

The letters of the solution are clued **in order**. The description of the film is a summary of the film title **after** being changed.

#### **CLUES AND PENALTIES**

The Spymaster, if you ask him, will tell you if a particular clue needs to have a letter removed, added, or changed, with a penalty of **1 minute** for each clue given in this way.

You **must** hand in a complete solution when returning to the Spymaster to claim the final puzzle, or can ask the Spymaster for any answers at any time, taking a **penalty** of **2 minutes** for **each answer** you cannot get.

### **PUZZLE 2 - MRS JONES' MIX-TAPE**

#### INTRODUCTION

Being the romantic sort, Mr. Jones had put together a mix tape for his beloved. At first glance, it's an eclectic collection, but all was not as it seems.

On closer inspection, you realise that there is a theme running through all of the songs in question.

#### NOTES

Each answer is two words, and the answer to the puzzle uses the **first** letter of **either** the **first** or **second** word of each answer (indicated by the presence of (1) or (2) after the clue) to give you the location of Puzzle 3.

#### **CLUES AND PENALTIES**

If you cannot work out the theme, you can obtain **one clue** (which should be all you need to get you on track (geddit?) from the Spymaster, but will incur a **penalty** of **5 minutes** for doing so.

You **must** hand in a complete solution when returning to the Spymaster to claim the final puzzle, or can ask the Spymaster for any answers at any time, taking a **penalty** of **2 minutes** for **each answer** you cannot get.

#### INTRODUCTION

A well-travelled man, Mr. Jones has hidden the location of the next puzzle within a series of ditloids. Solve the ditloids, and take the first letter of each answer to find the location of Puzzle 4.

#### NOTES

Each answer is the name of a town or city somewhere in the world. The answers are clued in order.

The letter to be used is the first letter of that town or city's name.

#### **EXAMPLE**

UK C whose tallest B is T S

would equate to

UK city whose tallest building is The Shard

giving you the answer of **London** and the letter **L**.

#### **PENALTIES**

You **must** hand in a complete solution when returning to the Spymaster to claim the final puzzle, or can take a **penalty** of **2 minutes** for **each answer** you cannot get.

## PUZZLE 4 - DAD PIERCED JUNIPER

#### INTRODUCTION

Mr. Jones was an avid reader and hid the location of the password in a series of anagrams, each of which corresponds to the title of a well-known book – he has also given the initials of the author as an additional clue.

The first letter of each book title must be put into the answer, but as an added layer of security, once solved, the answers must be put in **chronological order** of the book's publication date.

#### NOTES

The earliest book was released in 1937, the latest in 2006. Where the title of the book starts with the word "THE", that word is ignored for the purposes of the solution.

#### **EXAMPLE**

DAD PIERCED JUNIPER - J. A.

would equate to

PRIDE AND PREJUDICE - JANE AUSTEN

so the letter **P** would need to be put into the answer in the

correct chronological order.

#### PENALTIES AND CLUES

You can take a penalty of **5 x X minutes** (where X is the number of players in your team) to receive a simpler version of the puzzle where the clues are in chronological order and the authors first names are provided.

You **must** hand in a complete solution when returning to the Spymaster to claim the final puzzle, or can take a **penalty** of **2 minutes** for **each answer** you cannot get.

## **PUZZLE 5 - FIND THE SPY**

#### INTRODUCTION

Mr. Jones had been monitoring the five occupants of Hut 17 for some time.

Inside Hut 17, each occupant had their own office, numbered 1 to 5, laid out in a row with 1 at the left and 5 at the right, as you look at them from the entrance to the Hut.

When lock-down finished in 2020, each occupant returned to their freshly-painted offices, bringing in with them the dogs they had each newly-acquired over lockdown. By coincidence, each now owned a different breed of dog to the others.

Each office also receives a daily delivery of a (different) national newspaper, and a supply of the occupant's chosen drink.

Whilst trailing all five of them, at a safe distance, on a foggy lunchtime dog walk, Mr. Jones spotted one of them dropping their newspaper into a rubbish bin in the park that was a known Russian dead-drop location.

It was too dark to spot which individual it was, and the newspaper had gone by the time Mr. Jones reached the bin, but he had been able to tell that the dog which the mole was walking was a chihuahua.

Use the other clues that Mr. Jones left with the Spymaster to identify the owner of the chihuahua, and thus find the spy!

## **PUZZLE 5 - THE CLUES**

- 6. The Green office is immediately to the left (as you look at them) of the Orange office.

- 9. The Daily Mail is read in the middle of the five offices.
- 10. David works in the first office.
- 11. The person who drinks tea works in the office next to the person who has a Great Dane.
