Chairman's Welcome, by David Norman

Welcome to ManorCon XLI. This year sees two major changes to ManorCon, one happy, one sad.

Firstly, the sad news - the loss of the convention's chairman, Steve Jones. Steve missed MidCon in early November due to illness, and was starting to undergo tests at that time. By the end of December he had passed away from cancer. Steve had been on the ManorCon committee almost since its inception, and had been chairman since 1999. As well as leading the committee, being retired meant he also had the time to do a lot of the donkey-work to make it happen. He is sadly missed by all the committee members, and I'm sure, all the attendees who knew him. You will find various little stories about Steve dotted throughout the programme booklet.

I now have the job of attempting to fill his shoes. For those who don't know me, I've been attending ManorCon since 1994, joining the committee about 10 years later. In the early days, I could be found playing in, and then later, running the Diplomacy tournament. Nowadays, I can usually be found playing some mid-weight Euro games - often including Power Grid, Steam, and any other games which don't include hundreds of cards which all do different things!!!

Having the disadvantage of being employed, I'm grateful to the rest of the committee for sharing the work required to make the convention happen - Rachel Coe, who has stepped up to the role of Secretary after just one year on the committee, Mark Stretch, who is the treasurer, Dave Simpson, who you will often meet if you're still playing games at 3am, Graham Charlton who has joined the committee this year, and Gary Duke, whose work every year to take all the bookings and run the registration desk is massively appreciated.

The second big change is our new venue. After 17 years at Leicester, we have moved to the University of Northampton. Leicester was a great venue for the convention for many years, but behind the scenes, it has felt like we didn't really fit in there since we returned after Covid, and in the run-up to last year's convention, we decided to look for a new host. Thanks to Rachel for all the work she put into exploring options and doing the vast majority of the liaison with the University to get everything organised for the convention. So now we are back to having a venue with a restaurant, a permanent bar and all the gaming space under a single roof - something we've not had in the last decade.

So, a great new venue, lots of gamers, lots of games to play, and four days available to play them. I hope everybody enjoys their time at the convention, and best of luck in your games.

Remembering Steve Jones "At a games convention, Steve asked to borrow my copy of Puerto Rico. Borrowing games to play is common practice, although you can't be sure how well organised the bits will be afterwards. My game came back better organised than before, with neatly labelled ziplock baggies for the colonist tokens required for three, four, or five players."



Steve Jones's Legacy & Award

Steve was on the ManorCon committee since the late 1980's, becoming the chairman in 1999. As well as chairing the convention committee, he also managed the Convention finances for many years, and ran the 18XX Tournament at ManorCon. Steve had been involved in all aspects of ManorCon 2025 planning prior to his passing, including the move to Northampton. This year will not be the same without him.

Steve was originally from Australia and came to the UK to study at Cambridge followed by a long career as an Industrial Mathematician for Unilever. He enjoyed the heavier analytical games, which was obvious from his choice of games.

Vital Lacerda was his favourite boardgame designer with Steve being keen to teach anyone who wanted to learn, at ManorCon and many other conventions throughout the year.

We'd also like to give a huge thank you to Paul Grogan and Dranda Games; Paul organised a charity giveaway of Steve Jones's copy of Galactic Cruise, raising nearly £2,000 for Cancer Research UK.

There are some anecdotes about Steve that have been shared by the gaming community scattered throughout this programme to help remember him.

When you arrive....

Car Parking

Car parking payment is required on arrival, except for those staying in the Sunley Hotel, and those with a valid Blue Badge. Please use the on-site payment machines (card only) or RingGo facility (24700). The cost is £3 per day Monday to Friday and £1 per day on Saturday and Sunday.

If you have a valid Blue Badge, please provide your car registration number at the registration desk so we can make sure you are not charged.

Registration & Collecting your Key Card

Please go to the ManorCon Registration Desk on the ground floor of the Learning Hub. This is a short walk from the car park.

Everyone needs to first visit the registration desk, this is where you collect your badge if you have pre-booked and where you pay any money owing.

- For guests staying in the Sunley Hotel, you will then go to the hotel to collect your key card and register your car for parking.
- For guests staying in the halls of residences you will be provided with your room key as well as breakfast vouchers. Rooms will be in John Clare Hall & Margaret Bondfield Hall.

If you haven't prebooked, on the door registration is £10 for one day, £15 for the weekend.



Accommodation

All rooms are situated in either The Sunley Hotel (doubles) or Waterside Halls of Residence (singles), close to The Learning Hub and car park.

Everyone's accommodation includes Breakfast at the Market Restaurant. On arrival you will be provided with breakfast vouchers to use at the restaurant. Anybody who is not using accommodation can purchase breakfast in the Market Restaurant.

As in the past, the timing of ManorCon means temperatures can be high. To keep rooms cool it is recommended that you open your room window on arrival.

PLEASE NOTE: you must vacate your room and return your key by 9:30am on the day of your departure. All room keys should be returned to the ManorCon Registration Desk; there is a fee for not returning your room key card of £50 as detailed in the Terms and Conditions.

The Sunley Hotel

The Sunley Hotel is providing 20 double rooms for ManorCon. In-room facilities include an en-suite bathroom with shower and complimentary toiletries, complimentary Wi-Fi, coffee and tea making facilities, Freeview TV, iron and ironing board, direct dial telephone and a safe.

All bedrooms are accessible by lift and stairs, with the accommodation being secure and only accessible with a hotel guest's key card. The reception and lounge are located on the ground floor which has step-free access.

John Clare Hall & Margaret Bondfield Hall Student Rooms

All Waterside Halls of Residence Student Rooms are single, ensuite rooms located within the campus. Each room is within a flat with multiple ensuite rooms with shared kitchen facilities.

All student rooms are fully furnished with a bed, with full bed linen (duvet, pillows, sheet and covers), Ensuite shower, desk and chair, wardrobe and storage space, bookshelves or case and bin.

In flat items include a kettle, fridge/freezer, microwave, cooker/hob, iron & ironing board, dining table and chairs, soft seating, dustpan and brush and a set of basic crockery (cup, glass, plates and cutlery) per person.

You need to bring towels and toiletries with you.

Remembering Steve Jones “Steve would often volunteer to teach people how to play a game, but his explanations would always take a long time. As it was once described to me, he would read each sentence from the rulebook, out loud, and after each sentence, would then describe what that meant. The ultimate case of this was from CastleCon, where it is said that after breakfast, Steve taught a group how to play Starfarers of Catan. Then they had lunch, and then they played it!”

Remembering Steve Jones "I first met Steve at Airecon 2022 where he taught me how to play Underwater Cities. We played a 2 player game that we couldn't finish in time, so Steve suggested we leave the board up and resume first thing in the morning. That was my first ever convention. After we finished the game, Steve suggested we play another game together, this time Terraforming Mars, which he kindly was happy to teach my friend who hadn't played before. We spent much of the con together, it was great. He was so welcoming and kind. Such an interesting individual too with rich life experience. The subsequent cons I went to I always made it a point of trying to find the legendary Steve Jones."



Food and Drink

The Market Restaurant

The Market Restaurant is the largest restaurant on Waterside Campus and will be providing breakfast to those staying on site when presented with the vouchers provided. Breakfast will include traditional English breakfast items, yoghurts, cereal, toast, jams, hot drinks, etc. Those not staying onsite can also buy their breakfast.

The Market offers fresh produce and international cuisine and will be open through the day. It will also be the main evening restaurant providing a range of meal options. Main meals will be £8.50 including 2 sides, and there will be different lunch and evening meals each day to provide variety.

There will be a range of alcohol in the Market Restaurant, including bottled beer and small bottles of wine.

Morrisons Local and other shops.

There is also a small Morrisons Local shop on campus, which includes a post office with a cash point. The shop is open 7 am-10 pm seven days a week.

There are larger supermarkets within easy walking distance.

Remembering Steve Jones “I was heading home from a Con and passed Steve and two friends on the last turn of a game. It was a boardgame I was interested in, but hadn't had the chance to play. They finished the game and I explained my reason for watching. ‘Well,’ said Steve, ‘the game [first edition of Great Western Trail] plays better with four, would you care to join us for another game?’.

He went through the rules whilst setting it up, effortlessly teaching it so I knew what I was doing by the time we started. We played through, finished and totted up the scores. It was a really close game, and everyone had a great time. Steve started to collect the game together to put it away, paused, looked up and said ‘How about one more?’ And that's how I ended up not getting home until 1am. 😊 There are many gaming sessions that you remember, that one will fondly stay with me for a while.”

Second Hand Games Sale

ManorCon provides an opportunity for buyers and sellers of second-hand games to meet and complete transactions. The second-hand games sale will be open from 3pm on Friday 18 July 2025 until 10am on Monday 21 July 2025.

Sellers will be able to place their games in the SHGS and potential buyers will be able to peruse the games at their leisure throughout the convention.

Buyers will contact the sellers and pay them directly, with ManorCon providing suitable shelving space for the games. Games are sold as seen and the transaction is between the buyer and the seller. ManorCon accepts no responsibility for any damage or missing components in items sold between attendees.

Please do not bring games that are in shrink/unpunched to sell at the SHGS, if they are likely to be available for sale by the onsite retailer. We understand that you may have a surplus copy of a game that is still in shrink or unpunched, so exceptions can be made for single copies of games. If there is any doubt please check the website of our games retailer MeepleWorld (<https://www.meepleworld.uk/>).

For those with multiple games or who only want to bring the games they know they are selling due to size, there is an SHGS Google Sheet (<https://tinyurl.com/3yk32yax>) for you to enter your game details ahead of time. When entering your contact details, please be aware that the sheet is public, and ManorCon have no control over who accesses it.

Remembering Steve Jones “During one of our April visits to Leicester, we were sat on the soft cushion seating, waiting for the meeting with the University. Steve decided he wanted a cup of coffee, so went to the coffee machine in front of him. Finding it switched off, he turned around to go to the one on the other side of the room, only to fall over the soft cushion he'd been sat on only moments earlier, but had forgotten was there. For several years thereafter, the programme booklet marked the location of this in various ways, including a ‘trip hazard’ symbol, or the words ‘acrobatics display area’ in small writing.” ManorCon Committee



Diplomacy

Diplomacy returns to ManorCon with two rounds, at 10 am on Saturday and Sunday, meet in the Owls Nest from 9am. The tournament is being hosted by UK Diplomacy's Dan Lester (Cedarsave on BGG or Cedarsave@hotmail.com). Please reach out to participate and log your name in the games organiser.

Did you know that Manorcon STARTED as a Diplomacy convention? At one time more than 100 people were playing it... all at the same time... in one big room! We won't have that many this year, but if you have an itch to scratch, or if you want to dip your toe in the water to give it a try - you'll never get a better chance.

To take part in a game, be at the Owls Nest by 9:45am for a 10am game start on either Saturday or Sunday (or both!). A good time and a lunch break are guaranteed, as well as a finish before 3pm. And if you ARE quite new - well, super-friendly current UK Diplomacy champion, and former World champion, UK Diplomacy's Dan Lester is on hand to host, Tournament Director (TD) and even offer some tips.

Look out for the Diplomacy signs for where games are being played.

18XX

This year the 18XX tournament will be for The Lyndon Gurr Trophy, in honour of Lyndon Gurr who passed away 11th December 2024. Lyndon was a regular player in the 18XX room and one of the strongest 18XX players.

18XX are a whole stable of games mostly based around the theme of making money from running railways, with many games in the stable being named after a year from the eighteen hundreds, hence 18XX. The rules can be complex, but are often simpler than those of heavy euros, and vary from game to game within the genre. These games offer a range of strategies, as they have several moving parts which interact in ways that are rather hard to predict.

Essentially, they are complex business games. Each game consists of two interacting sub-games: one in which the players buy and sell shares in the railway companies, and one in which the players run the railway companies (this last involves building track, buying trains and running services). 18XX games tend to be long (from 4 to 10 hours).

These games will mostly be played in the Quiet Gaming area. If you want to try one of these games out, a teaching game will begin at 9 a.m. on Saturday and Sunday, and Monday too if there's a demand. Games do start at other times of the day, but only infrequently when other games finish.

If you want to know more speak to Steve Thomas, Ian D Wilson, and Dave Berry who will provide more information. Look out for the 18XX signs for where games are being played.

To take part in the ad-hoc 18XX tournament just play, record the results on the forms provided, and put them in the envelope(s) provided.

Remembering Steve Jones "I can't remember what game we borrowed from Steve but it was perfectly organised. I remember first seeing him coming into Midcon 2016 with his plastic boxes neatly packed with games. 'That looks like a lot of effort' I thought at the time. On the Sunday as he calmly walked out with his trolley whilst I went back and forth with bags galore I thought 'Maybe there's something in that!' I played Isle of Skye and No Thanks with him on the Saturday whilst he came down from a heavy gaming session (possibly 18xx). He didn't seem to find it anywhere near as funny as my fringe did that he shared his name with the guitarist from The Sex Pistols, but then they had known each other for years and I suspect he'd had this pointed out at every possible occasion."



Wingspan Tournament

This year Philip and Bekki Honeybone will be running a Wingspan / Wyrmspan / Finspan tournament. They will be based near the Second Hand Games Sale.

All games of Wingspan / Wyrmspan / Finspan played at Manorcon 2025 can be entered into the tournament as long as there are 3 or more players. Each player will score points for each game they play. Each game must be played according to its normal rules. Points will be awarded based on players and position.

A scoresheet must be completed for each game and placed in the box on the registration desk. They must identify the players and their final position. If a player does not wish to be entered into the tournament, a scoresheet can still be entered and the respective player(s) recorded as "AN1", "AN2" etc.

The tournament finishes on Sunday night with all results being submitted by 9am Monday to allow the winner to be determined and trophy to be presented.

Treasure Hunt - Mr. Jones's Last Puzzle

This year Giles Bennett will be hosting the Sunday afternoon Treasure Hunt at 2pm in the Waterside Bar and Restaurant.

Mr. Jones's Last Puzzle Overview

Before he died, Steve had unearthed a mole inside Bletchley Park. Five people were under suspicion, but Steve had figured out who the mole was. In true fashion, he hadn't written their names down but had set a series of six puzzles of increasing difficulty.

The final puzzle reveals the identity of the spy. Each of the five preceding puzzles gives three clues (so a total of 15 clues) that together allow you to solve the final puzzle. When you solve one of the first five puzzles, you take your solution to one of the suspects, who gives you a slip of paper with their three clues on it.

Teams are allowed to skip a round, but incur an X minute time penalty if completely stuck. Then, when you get all fifteen clues, you have enough to solve the final puzzle. The first team to accost the spy wins!

Pop Quiz

Join us in the Waterside Bar on Saturday at 10pm for a couple of hours of music, fun and fabulous* prizes with The Pop Quiz, hosted by Philip Hannay.

This is a light-hearted and fun quiz with a variety of different rounds and difficulties, so there's something for everyone and you don't have to be a music guru to have a good time.

This is a team event for teams of up to four, but don't worry if you don't have a team in advance; we will sort out the teams at the start to make sure everyone gets to take part.

* prize fabulousness is subjective and varies. Some prizes are definitely better than others.

Remembering Steve Jones "Someone once borrowed a game from Steve and, knowing how fastidious he was, made a great effort to return the game as he found it. Steve came over and thanked the man for doing a good job on putting the game away but did note that he had not colour-matched the elastic bands with the colours of the cards enclosed in the elastic bands, i.e. yellow band around the yellow deck and so on. Classic Steve."



Midnight Party

Midnight Party goes by many names including Escape from the Hidden Castle, Hugo: Das Schlossgespenst, Ghost Party and Midnight Party.

The idea of the game is to avoid being caught by Hugo the Ghost in a kind of musical chairs in which a limited number of rooms (to hide in) take the place of the chairs. It started many years ago as an unofficial event, but has become more and more popular (and cultish) each year. Each round takes about 45 minutes, and it is very easy to learn how to play.

Midnight Party will be run at midnight each night. Usually it is located in the bar.

Paul Grogan of gaming rules will be bringing copies of games due for release at Essen and designer Mandela Fernandez-Grandon will be bringing his latest games to be released at Essen Ayar: Children of the Sun.

Departure Information

ManorCon Closing Time

The convention finishes at 2pm on Monday.

The Market Restaurant and The Waterside Bar & Restaurant will remain open for customers, with all other ManorCon event areas needing to be cleared by 2pm.

Accommodation

On the day of check out please strip bedding and leave it in the room. Ensure kitchen items are left clean if in the Halls single rooms.

Remembering Steve Jones “Steve taught my wife and I Darwin’s Journey late 2023, played Mosaic with him too. I think of him when I get our copy of Darwin’s Journey out as we liked it so much playing it with Steve we bought it soon after.”



Code of Conduct

The Code of Conduct applies to all attendees, organisers, and volunteers at ManorCon events. ManorCon promotes kindness, inclusivity, and respect among all participants.

What is the Code of Conduct?

We care about inclusive, safe and happy gaming spaces and as such we have a Code of Conduct which we expect all attendees, volunteers, exhibitors and staff to abide by. This is applicable to both the conventions and the online space surrounding them (Facebook page, group and events, Game Finder and any other online or social media spaces).

1. Good manners: please be courteous and respectful to one another. Every person has an equal right to game and to enjoy the convention in safe and hygienic surroundings. Please be aware that some people are new to gaming, or like to play different games than you. Consider if your behavior could be interpreted differently by other members of our community.
2. Harassment: please remember that everyone has a right to enjoy their hobby in a safe and non-sexual environment, and no-one should be sexualised without their consent. Harassment includes but is not limited to:
 - a. Offensive verbal comments
 - b. Explicit sexual images or references
 - c. Unwanted attention or following of persons
 - d. Unwanted recording or photography
 - e. Sustained disruption of games or activities
 - f. Inappropriate physical contact
 - g. Inappropriate or insensitive remarks about gender or gender identity
 - h. Repeated misgendering or failure to respect someone's preferred pronouns
 - i. Needlessly or repeatedly drawing attention to someone's physical characteristics
3. Alcohol: please feel free to drink responsibly. Alcohol is not an excuse for loud, aggressive or inappropriate behavior.
4. Being allowed back: There are rules that the University has, such as only drinking alcohol in designated areas. Most items fall under 1. Good Manners. Please can you follow the University's Rules so we can come back again next year.

What happens if there is a Code of Conduct Breach?

Breaching this Code of Conduct may result in actions including potentially being ejected from ManorCon and/or being banned from future ManorCon events

How can violations of the Code of Conduct be reported?

You can report violations to a designated ManorCon committee member, who will handle the matter confidentially.

How many people attend ManorCon?

We are expecting approximately 350 people in total, mainly registered for the whole weekend.

What type of Games are played at ManorCon?

There are a mix of games from lighter party games, such as Just One, through to 18XX games (there are 3-5 tables of 18XX per day). To help people find games there is a games organiser online, and player wanted signs at the convention.

How accessible is the new venue?

The venue is new and meets the relevant accessibility requirements with details on <https://www.accessable.co.uk/>. There are small level changes on the ground floor, all with platform lifts which do not require assistance to use, so that everyone can access. There is one small area that is above the Market Restaurant that is only accessed via stairs. No activities have been planned for this area. Full information is available on AccessAble.

Is there a games library?

There is a small games library at ManorCon consisting of four games which were donated from Steve Jones collection

- The Gallerist
- Inventions: Evolution of Ideas.
- Darwins Journey
- Brass Birmingham

People bring lots of games and usually are willing to lend if you ask or even better play with you. There are also people with preview copies of unreleased games. They may be available to borrow if you ask the owner.

Is there Wi-Fi?

There is guest wi-fi available. To connect to the guest wifi:

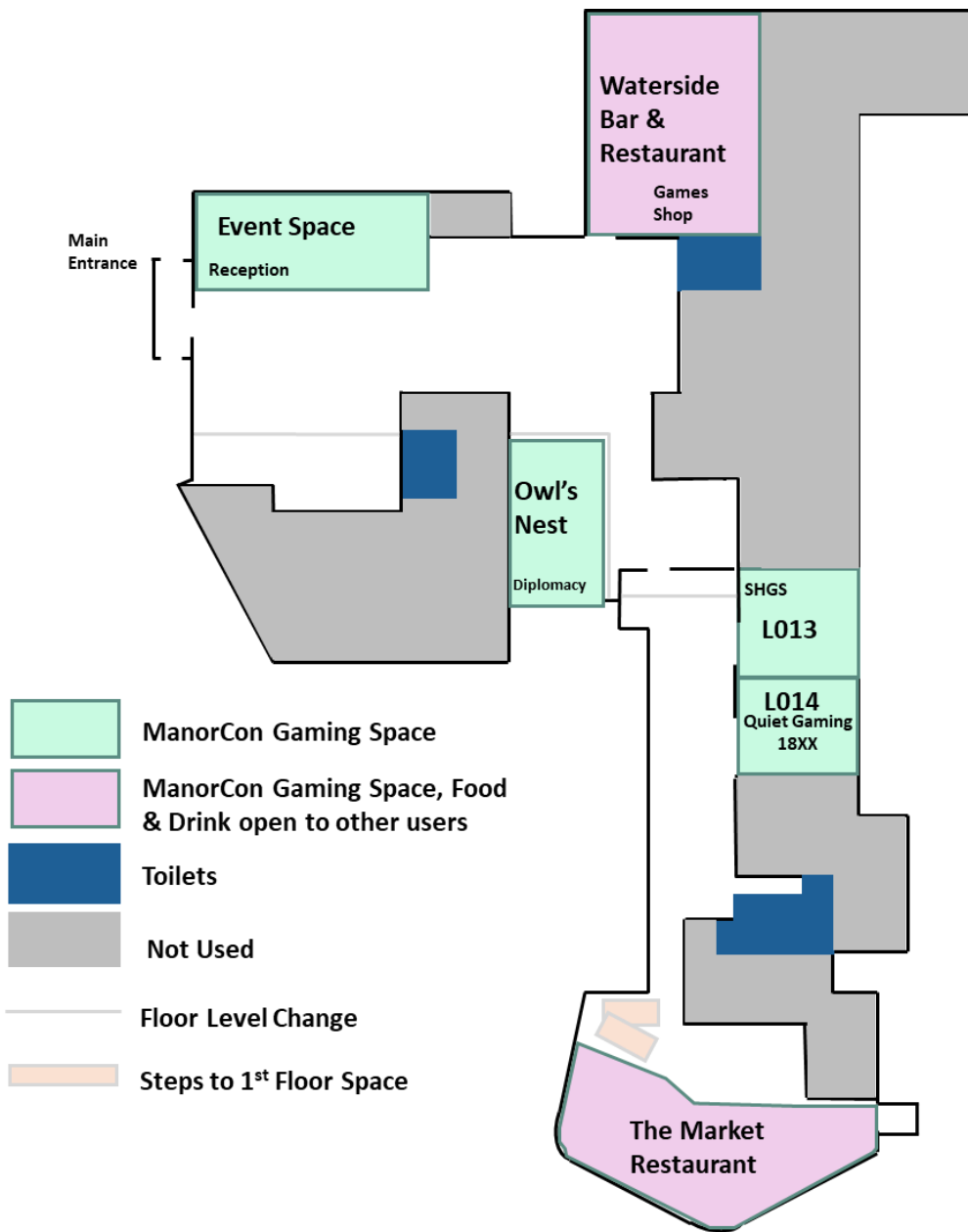
1. Click on the wifi icon on your device and look for the UON_Guest network and press connect
2. The browser on your device will open with a sign-in window. Press On "register for guest access", which is the bottom option.
3. On the next window, fill in the details. It is only necessary to fill out the asterisk (*) sections, which is your first name and last name. You do not need to provide an email address or phone number. Then press Register.
4. Your sign in details will be provided, press Sign On. If you forget these details you can always register again. It will give you a username and password, and confirm your first and last name.
5. You will then see the 'Acceptable Use Policy' and you must press Accept to accept the Terms and Conditions. Your browser page will load up the University website. You are now connected to the University's guest network.

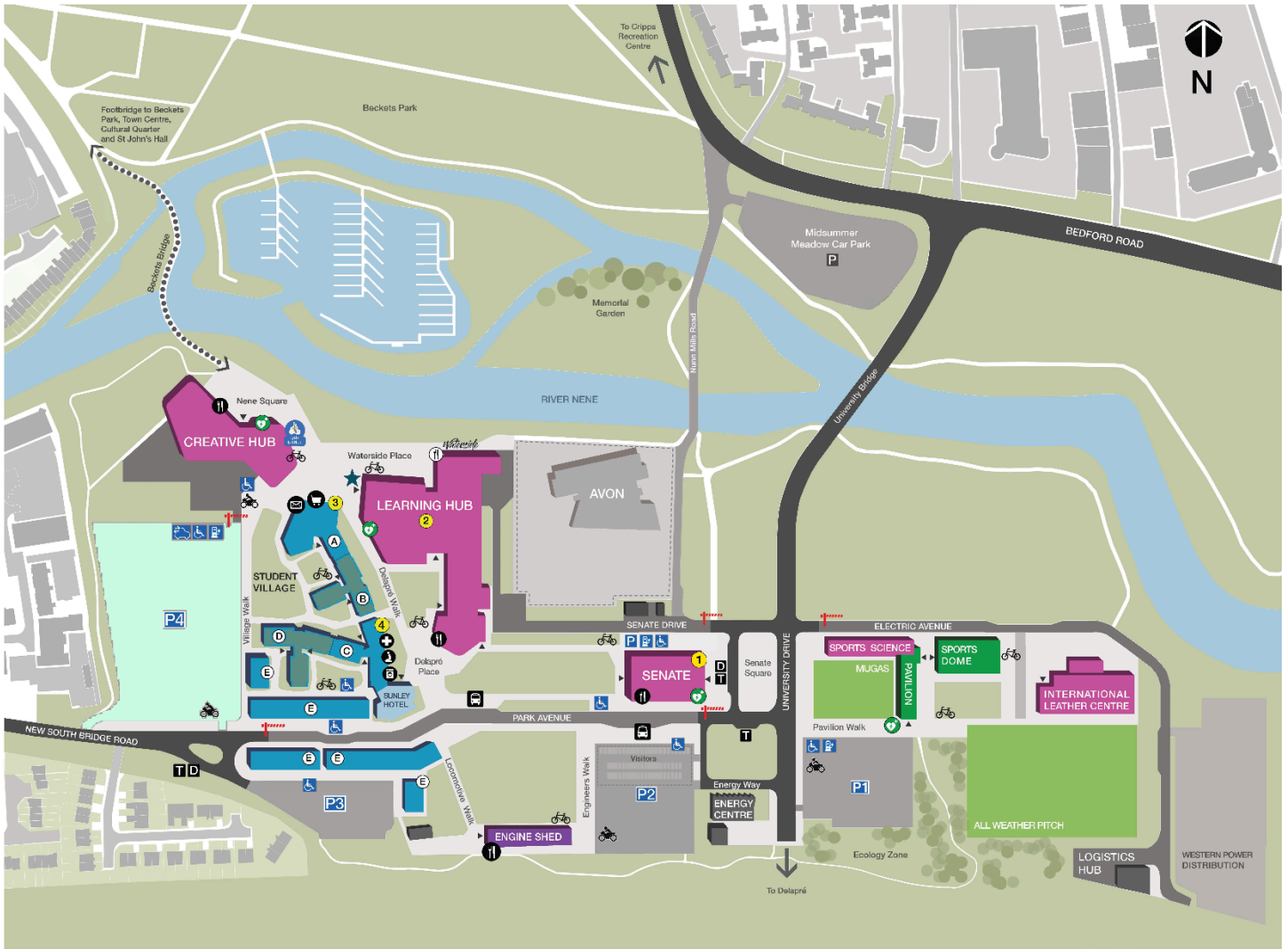
